15. Be well informed of the industry and your job. You need to grow roots in the area you want to dominate and that comes from building and expanding your knowledge base - everyday.


16. Know this well, no matter what you do, your work impacts and influences others. Be mindful and be responsible in doing a good job.

**Some reflections, food for thought... to invite your genius to fore:**


1. What is it that you love to do? What would you like to pursue? Something that has been tugging at your heart for a long time?




4. How will you keep your focus and continue in your effort when people ridicule you or don't believe in you and don't support you?
